Town political history notes:

1763--The town of "Shenandoah Falls at Mr Harper's Ferry" recognized by an act of the Virginia General Assembly 1827--8 January: An act by the Virginia General Assembly established the town of "Virginus."

1851--24 March: The town of "Harper's Ferry" incorporated by an act of the Virginia General Assembly, which also absorbed the town of Virginus. 13 December 1852.

1852--Town surveyed and platted by S Howell Brown; sale of Armory lots to workers. Further sales in 1853.

1863--20 June: State of West Virginia established. "Retrocession of Jefferson County ...from the seceded Commonwealth of Virginia to the new State of Virginia would seem to have abandoned the legislative contract formerly between now disassociated parties." [Kusner, 1984]

1867--21 February: WV Legislature repealed the act of Virginia which incorporated Harper's Ferry. [Other towns also had charters and incorporation. Subsequent administration apparently by County Supervisors under Township rules.

1868--23 December: WV Legislature united Townships of Bolivar and Harper's Ferry into a new entity called "Bolivar township." 1869--Sale of Armory lots. 1872--6 April, Saturday: From the *Virginia Free Press*, published in Charles Town WV: "On Thursday of last week [4 April] a vote was taken by the town of Harper's Ferry to determine whether or not application should be made for an incorporation of the Town. The vote resulted-- for, 67; against, 32. The result indicates but little interest in the matter."

--16 April the Circuit Court of Jefferson County issued a certificate of incorporation to the Town of Harpers Ferry.

1878--Sale of Armory lots. Further sales in 1880, 1881, 1884.

1944--30 June: Congress authorises Harpers Ferry National Monument. Became National Park 29 April 1963.

Notes on elections and terms:

1. The mayor and council under Virginia laws were elected in early May, and served one year terms from June to May, from 1851 to 1860. The town had a recorder, and nine councilmen. [In 1853, the Virginia Free Press reported the election of "Trustees".]
2. There seems to have been no election in 1861 due to the turmoil surrounding secession.
3. Town affairs administered under martial law of occupying forces 1861 to 1865.
4. [elections in 1866?]
5. Town dis-incorporated 21 Feb 1867. Town affairs apparently conducted by County Supervisors under township law. United with Bolivar Township 1868 to 30 June 1872.
6. The first mayor and council after incorporation under WVa law were elected 7 June 1872 and served until 31 Jan 1873. The town had a mayor, a recorder, and five councilmen.
7. Elections were in January from 1873 to 1929, usually in the first week. Terms ran 1 February to 31 January the next year.
8. Elections were and are held in June from 1930 to present. Terms ran from 1 July to 30 June.
9. Terms were one year from 1873 to 1933.
10. From July 1933 to present, terms were and are 2 years, from 1 July in odd years to 30 June the next odd year.
11. Slate elected 1929 served from 1 February 1929 to June 30 1930, as a transition between elections in January and elections in June.
