In 1850 the population of Harpers Ferry was 1,747 but stands today at 263. Something y'all probably already know but bear with me.

Roberta Meade-Curry made a point during her JCDA interview with the county commission to note that three new houses have recently been built and three renovated. But over half of those are short-term rentals so what about those who want to make Harpers Ferry their forever home?

With the unfortunate closing of the Mather Training Center this provides the town of Harpers Ferry with an opportunity to broaden the availability of its housing stock as well as increase the number of permanent residents. Working with the National Park Service and GSA along with historic properties developers, the town could turn empty NPS buildings into bespoke condos and apartments as well as desperately needed workforce/affordable housing. I include the old Harpers Ferry High School, another empty NPS building, in this proposal as understand the trifecta of big ticket restoration items: widows, the roof and asbestos have all been taken care of.

I know housing is not high on the current administration's list of priorities. However, as a recent Ranson city council member ,I would have given anything for the possibility of converting non-failing down buildings (schools are the go-to option for repurposing buildings) into much needed housing. And I'll leave y'all with these thoughts: there's no headache of trying to build a house on town lots – the buildings are already there, also HELLO they come with their own parking so that headache is gone as well, and last but not least permanent residents of the *Shipley Apartments*, etc. will consistently eat, drink and shop during the months of January, February and March.

RE: 7(a). Discussion and action regarding the creation of a committee to study population decline in Harpers Ferry.

I do want to encourage the town council to take a more progressive approach toward our population situation, especially an approach based on credible data.

My first suggestion would be to take a more positive approach and create a **committee to study strategies for recruiting new long-term residents**. After all, the population of Harpers Ferry has declined with every census since Storer College closed. Is there anything new to see here? Loss of local employment opportunities, limited and aging housing stock that doesn't fit modern family needs, high cost of renovation and maintenance of historic buildings, and home-seller demand for top dollar pricing have been cited repeatedly as factors for decline.

Actually, our population decline has stabilized somewhat over the last two decades, from 30% in 1960 to 15% in 1990 to 6% in 2020.

How about working to learn

- Which community amenities might attract new residents?
- How might we help with low-interest financing for renovations of aging homes?
- How can we promote and message the benefits of living full-time in this beautiful town?

There are many opportunities to learn how to improve our image as a livable community.

If you do decide it is wise to expend energy on looking backward, I would be very curious about what data you will use to answer the question. It seems like a topic that might be easy to skew toward a certain predetermined agenda.

To reach a better-informed conclusion based on thorough analysis, I would encourage you to diversify the expertise on the committee. Perhaps include

- A local historian who is familiar with population patterns
- A real estate professional who is conversant with both sellers and buyers of our homes
- A building contractor who can speak to the cost of renovations and difficulties of maintaining our historic homes
- Maybe even a resident who also owns a business in town.

I'm not sure how studying decades-old population decline solves any problems, but we could sure use some good data on how to move forward.

ORDER NO. 3434

Subject: Strengthening Coordination with Gateway Communities

Sec. 1. **Purpose.** This Order establishes the Department of the Interior (Department) policy to enhance coordination and strengthen partnerships with gateway communities. These communities play a vital role in visitor management, conservation outcomes, and supporting the economic vitality surrounding public lands. Through this Order, the Department commits to deepening collaborative planning, meaningful engagement, and shared stewardship with gateway communities.

Sec. 2. **Authority.** This Order is issued under the authority of 43 U.S.C. § 1451 *et seq.*; the National Park Service Organic Act, as amended and supplemented 54 U.S.C. § 100101 *et seq.*; the challenge cost-share and cooperative agreement authorities, 54 U.S.C. §§ 101701–101702; and other applicable authorities.

Sec. 3. **Gateway Communities – Definition.** For the purposes of this Order, "gateway communities" are defined as cities, towns, Tribes, or unincorporated areas that are geographically adjacent to, or serve as the primary access point to a unit of the National Park System. These communities often provide critical infrastructure and services for System unit operations and visitors, including lodging, food services, emergency response, transportation, and recreation-related amenities.

Although diverse in size and governance, gateway communities share a mutual stake in the success, sustainability, and management of nearby Federal lands. Their proximity makes them highly sensitive to Federal land management decisions, including those affecting visitor access, resource protection, infrastructure development, fire mitigation, and tourism.

This definition includes communities that:

- Border or lie within a reasonable proximity of a System unit.
- Experience consistent economic, social, or environmental interaction with System unit operations.
- Provide essential services to visitors or System unit employees.
- Have a demonstrated interest in participating in collaborative planning and shared stewardship of System unit resources.

Sec. 4. **Background.** Gateway communities are essential partners in the success and sustainability of the National Park System. These communities provide critical infrastructure,

such as lodging, emergency services, transportation, and hospitality support that millions of park visitors rely on each year. Their proximity to Federal lands means that decisions made within a System unit—such as changes in access, visitor management strategies, or fee management—can have immediate and lasting impacts on local economies, housing markets, public safety services, and environmental conditions.

In many cases, gateway communities also serve as stewards of the lands and cultural and historical resources surrounding a System unit and contribute to the visitor experience through education, interpretation, and local initiatives. Yet, despite their central role, engagement with these communities has been inconsistent across System units and often lacks a formal structure for input or participation in planning and decision-making processes.

Strengthening engagement with gateway communities ensures that the Department upholds its obligations to support balanced, sustainable use of public lands while reinforcing the importance of local voices in Federal land management. Community input is vital to successful planning, conflict resolution, and long-term partnerships that benefit both the American public and the protected landscapes they cherish.

Sec. 5. **Department Policy.** The Department's policy is to:

- a. Recognize gateway communities as key stakeholders in System Unit management and planning.
- b. Foster transparent, ongoing communication between System units and gateway leadership.
- c. Leverage Federal programs and authorities to support the needs and capacities of gateway communities.
- d. Institutionalize accountability for community engagement within National Park Service management practices.

Sec. 6. Required Actions.

- a. **Formal Engagement.** The National Park Service Director (Director) shall ensure that:
 - 1. Each System unit conducts at least one quarterly coordination meeting with gateway community leadership.
 - 2. Each System unit documents and considers gateway community input in general management plans, environmental assessments, environmental impact statements, visitor use strategies, and fee proposals.
 - 3. For purposes of this Order, any applicable Tribal consultation shall constitute formal engagement.
- b. **Early Notification on Major Changes.** System units must engage early with gateway communities when proposing any actions that may affect local access,

tourism flows, or regional economic activity. Engagement must occur before any public comment period opens.

- c. **Technical and Financial Support.** The Director shall:
 - 1. Maximize the use of existing authorities—including cooperative agreements, the Challenge Cost Share Program, and the Federal Lands Access Program—to support gateway community needs, including transportation, housing, emergency services, and infrastructure.
 - 2. Provide technical assistance to communities seeking Federal support or pursuing grant opportunities for community development and resilience.
- d. **Gateway Community Coordinator.** The Director shall require that each System unit designate a Gateway Community Coordinator to serve as the primary point of contact for all matters related to State, Tribal, and local government engagement, regional coordination, and community partnership development. This role may be assigned as a collateral duty or incorporated into an existing position, depending on the System unit's size and structure. The Gateway Community Coordinator shall:
 - 1. Facilitate ongoing communication and coordination with gateway community leaders.
 - 2. Ensure timely engagement and incorporation of community input into relevant System unit planning and decision-making processes.
 - 3. Support the implementation of Department guidance on best practices for community engagement.
 - 4. Elevate issues requiring cross-jurisdictional or interagency coordination to the appropriate regional or national offices.

This approach promotes localized accountability and ensures every System unit has a designated liaison for meaningful gateway community collaboration.

- e. **Performance and Accountability.** Beginning in fiscal year 2026, superintendents of System units will have their performance appraisals include an evaluation of community engagement efforts, including responsiveness to local input, frequency and quality of engagement, and use of support programs.
- Sec. 7. **Reporting and Evaluation.** Within 180 days of the issuance of this Order, the Director shall submit an initial report to the Secretary summarizing:
 - The baseline level of engagement with gateway communities across all System units.
 - The designation status of Gateway Community Coordinators at each System unit.

- Progress toward implementing the engagement, coordination, and support measures described in this Order.
- Recommendations for improving System unit-community collaboration, including best practices, training needs, or policy adjustments.

Each subsequent year, the Director shall submit an annual update to the Secretary that includes:

- A summary of engagement activities and outcomes across System units.
- Metrics and case studies illustrating successful coordination efforts.
- System unit-specific challenges and corrective actions taken.
- Recommendations for enhancing accountability and consistency in community engagement efforts.

These reports shall inform Departmental strategic planning, performance evaluation frameworks, and any future policy refinements.

Sec. 8. Effect of the Order. This Order is intended to improve the internal management of the Department and to promote consistent and meaningful coordination with gateway communities. This Order and any resulting reports, directives, or actions are not intended to, and do not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, instrumentalities, or entities, its officers or employees, or any other person. To the extent that there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this Order and any Federal laws or regulations, those laws or regulations shall govern and control.

Sec. 9. Effective Date. This Order is effective immediately and remains in effect until amended, superseded, or revoked.

Budget & Finance Committee (B&F or BFC)

Approved by Town Council: xx/xx/2025

Mission

The Budget and Finance Committee (B&F or BFC) is a standing committee of the Town Council of the Corporation of Harpers Ferry. It shall be generally responsible for monitoring and maintaining the health and integrity of the town's finances, in accordance with standards and practices per the West Virginia State Auditor's Office (WV SAO).

Duties and Responsibilities

B&F acts in a advisory role to the Mayor and Town Council, and shall have no line authority over any employee or office practice or procedure in pursuit of its mission. In conjunction with the town's chief financial officer, it shall:

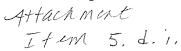
- Maintain oversight of the town's budgets and other financial statements, including but not limited to all revenues and expenses, capital accounts, bonds, and other financial elements.
- Develop all necessary and prudent financial policies and procedures, in accordance with WV SAO requirements and other established fiscal requirements and best practices.
- Be responsible for developing or vetting of town contracts, including conducting due diligence; bid preparation, evaluation, and award recommendation; and tracking contract compliance.
- Be responsible for vetting loans, grants, and other funding sources, and tracking their compliance.
- Be responsible for risk management policy development and tracking.
- Ensure that the Town Council remains well-informed about the state of the town's finances and other matters that come before the committee.

Membership

- The BFC shall be composed of three (3) members of the current Town Council.
- The BFC members shall have term limits which coincide with the term limit of the current Town
- The town's chief finance officer shall hold a seat on the BFC as an ex officio non-voting member, whose seat shall not be counted when determining a quorum.
- A representative of the Water Commission shall hold a seat on the BFC as an ex officio non-voting member, whose seat shall not be counted when determining a quorum.

Meetings

- A regular meeting shall be held once a month, unless otherwise posted or indicated on the agenda.
 - o The Regular meeting day shall be far enough ahead of the monthly Regular Town Council meeting day to allow the committee's agenda item requests to be placed on the upcoming Town Council agenda.





Internal Operations Committee (IOC) - July 30, 2025 IOC revision and recommendation

The Internal Operations Committee is established, under the leadership of the Mayor, by the Harpers Ferry Town Council and staffed by a maximum of three current members of the Town Council. The Committee is guided by a chairperson and the tenure of the Committee members coincides with the elected term of the Town Council. The IOC is responsible for examining and making recommendations to the Mayor on a wide range of issues relating to the effectiveness and efficiency of office management practices and procedures. The Committee has no lineauthority over any employee or administrative process. Its function is strictly advisory to the Mayor and/or Town Council.

The Committee also reviews all job applications and assembles a list of best-qualified candidates based upon objective job-related criteria developed by the IOC. Following the application review process, the Mayor is briefed on the top candidates being recommended to receive a job interview. The committee conducts the interview using objective questioning criteria, and makes a hiring recommendation to the Mayor.

At the request of the Mayor or Town Council, the Committee examines the workflow and processes of a workplace entity and recommends process changes to the Mayor. IOC makes recommendations on the development of new position descriptions for newly developed positions. It also ensures that all position descriptions accurately reflect their current duties and responsibilities, and makes recommendations for changes and updates to the Mayor. At the request of the Mayor, the IOC may be asked to conduct a detailed work audit of any position and make recommendations to the Mayor for any changes.

When requested by the Mayor or Recorder, the IOC reviews employee personnel conduct that may lead to disciplinary action. This also encompasses employee grievances concerning a workplace working environment or another employee or elected official. If the employee complaint involves the Mayor, the Recorder has authority to request the IOC to review the complaint against the Mayor and refer results of the inquiry to the Recorder for any action. If the complaint involves the Recorder or another elected official the Mayor will engage the IOC. During this process the IOC must adhere to all procedures contained within the Employee Handbook.

When requested by the Mayor or Town Council, the IOC reviews and makes recommendations to the Mayor about office organizational and technology platforms that may help Town Hall and/or the Water Works operate with greater efficiency and accuracy. If the approved changes would affect the Town's finances, the item would be remanded to the Budget & Finance Committee for financial review and bid preparation, if applicable.

IOC is responsible for ensuring that the Employee Handbook is regularly reviewed and updated. If the IOC review indicates changes are needed, the committee shall makes recommendations to the Mayor and Town Council to implement all changes following any legal review deemed necessary and prudent.

The also IOC reviews Town Hall working spaces and makes recommendations regarding modifications to office spaces or other structural changes at Town Hall, including estimated costs.

The Committee has delegated authority to include a subject matter expert (SME) to serve as needed. Any SME would serve only as an advisory member and/or observer.

Meetings of the IOC are conducted in adherence to all WV Code and Ethics Commission guidelines.

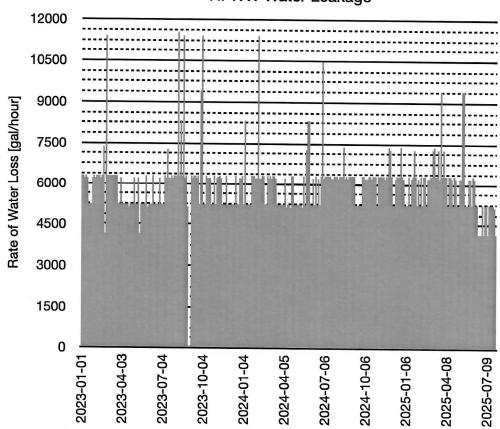

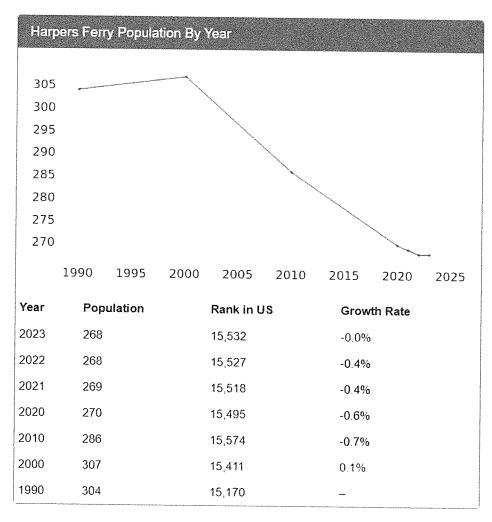

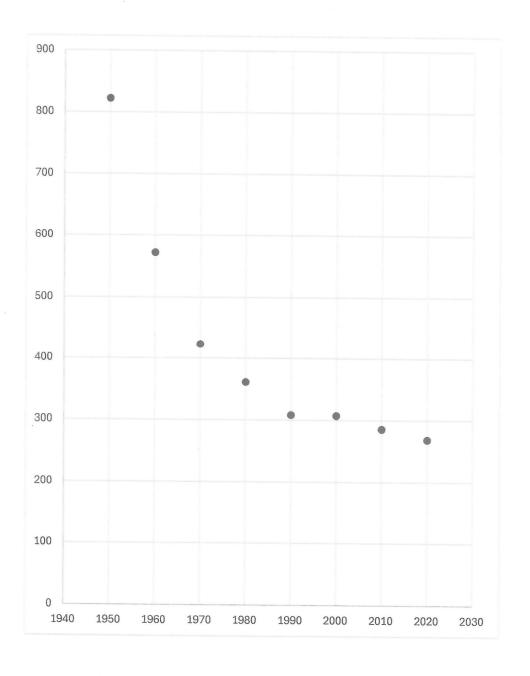
Harpers Ferry Population History 1990 - 2023

Dear Mayor Vaughn,

I'm writing to raise a pressing concern regarding Amtrak's long-distance service to your city.

Despite Congress authorizing substantial funding through the 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) to replace Amtrak's aging long-distance fleet, no order has yet been placed. This delay, paired with worsening equipment shortages and the retirement of damaged or outdated cars, places these essential routes at serious risk.

Recent issues—such as corrosion sidelining the entire Horizon car fleet—underscore the urgency of replacing the Amfleet and Superliner cars. Your voice is crucial in securing swift action to protect this national service.

Long-distance trains are a cost-effective way to connect hundreds of cities and towns. Passengers get on and off the train all along its route, some riding for just a stop or two, some going the entire distance from the Midwest to the coasts. Riders who pay a premium for private rooms help subsidize the train, making rural transportation affordable for the short-distance riders. These trains offer vital, affordable mobility especially in rural areas—and foster tourism and economic opportunity in the cities they serve.

We respectfully ask you to work with your congressional delegation to:

- A) Urge Amtrak to expedite fleet procurement, and
- B) Ensure federal funding for new rolling stock remains intact.

We are also circulating a sign-on letter asking US Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy to help expedite the procurement. A draft is attached; to add your name, please send a signed PDF on your letterhead to info@HSRail.org.

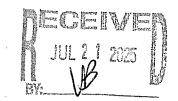

RE: Purdue Pharma/Sackler Family Settlement Announcement and Procedures

Dear Community Leader:

I write today with important news concerning the recently announced settlement with the Purdue Pharma bankruptcy estate and direct settlement with Purdue's owners, the Sackler family.

Thousands of lawsuits were filed nationwide against Purdue Pharma and the Sacklers in the past ten years, including many by West Virginia local governments and the West Virginia Attorney General's office. These suits alleged Purdue Pharma and the Sacklers exacerbated the ongoing opioid crisis through deceptive and misleading marketing of prescription opioids. Purdue Pharma filed for bankruptcy protection in 2019, staying litigation and potential settlement negotiation nationwide. After six long years of legal battles, and an argument before the U.S. Supreme Court, the Purdue Pharma bankruptcy is coming to a close.

A new, revised bankruptcy plan for Purdue Pharma combined with a direct settlement with the Sackler family are in the process of being finalized. Under this hybrid structure, West Virginia can receive as much as \$53 million in settlement payments over 9 years. These funds will be distributed to West Virginia communities, the West Virginia First Foundation, and the State, subject to the terms of the West Virginia First Memorandum of Understanding.

The total potential recovery West Virginia can receive depends on participation by communities like yours. The greater the number of West Virginia cities and counties that join this settlement the greater the amount of our potential collective recovery. Additionally, and most importantly, your local government must affirmatively participate in this process in order to receive payments under this settlement.

You will soon receive a sign-on packet from Rubris, a national opioid settlement participation administrator, containing pertinent information about the hybrid settlement, a Participation Form that must be signed and returned by your local government, and detailed instructions on how to return the form.

The form must be returned on or before September 30, 2025, in order to secure your local government's eligibility to receive settlement funds.

Sign-on packets are expected to be distributed by Rubris beginning the week of July 14. Please contact my office if you have not received your packet by July 31.

I strongly encourage you to contact your local legal counsel or any outside attorneys or firms your community may have previously retained for opioid litigation purposes to discuss this settlement.
