*Whereas*, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products, and

*Whereas*, trees in our town increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and

*Whereas*, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal,


